7. To create a COMMUNITY of LEARNERS.

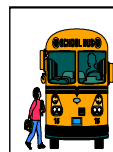
2009-2010 Target Goals for Tidehaven ISD

TAKS TESTS

The Spring of 2009 marked the 7th time students have taken the TAKS tests. Starting with the senior class of 2004, mastery of Exit level tests in English/Lang. Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies is required to receive a Texas high school diploma. Students who do not master one of the Exit level exams are given additional opportunities to pass the test during his/her junior and/or senior years.

State Accountability Ratings

TEA has implemented an accountability system that rates all school campuses and districts as 1) Exemplary; 2) Recognized; 3) Academically Acceptable; or 4) Academically Unacceptable. These ratings are based on indicators including completion rates and TAKS scores. Based on this accountability system, the Tidehaven School District earned an ACCEPTABLE rating. At the campus level, one (1) campus received a RECOGNIZED rating, while three (3) campuses received an Acceptable rating. Blessing Elementary received a RECOGNIZED rating. Markham Elementary, Tidehaven Intermediate and Tidehaven High School received an Acceptable rating. With an ever-increasing diversification of the district's student population and the more difficult TAKS tests, our administrators, teachers, and students have worked very hard to achieve these ratings. Because of a very dedicated staff, these ratings will only improve.
